LETTER FROM THE CEO



2020 a year that prohibited celebrations, including our 20th anniversary. Twenty years, over 1,000 mothers, over 675 babies called Maggie's Place home. The plans we had to gather and

share stories changed to a virtual gathering. Maggie's Place thrives on human interaction, hugs, tears of joy and sorrow. 2020 prevented us from sharing that outside of our homes. However, within the walls of our homes life went on, we remained open and we celebrated births. The AmeriCorps members and our moms stepped up when we had to close the world out. Volunteers were no longer welcomed into our homes, but they remained there for us, delivering meals via doorbell ditch and sending packages with needed supplies. The community provided in-kind and financial gifts that allowed us to house and feed those most vulnerable.

Our core values of Love, Community, Hospitality and Excellence kept up grounded, focused on the mothers, babies and families that needed us – now more than ever.

Your 2020 investment provided safe housing to 85 mothers, 49 children and 30 babies. The pandemic forced isolation upon us, yet Maggie's Place provided safe, trauma informed, homes for our moms and families to thrive.

Thank you to the many volunteers who provided meals, kept our toilet paper stocked, called to check on us and kept us in their prayers. Your acts of kindness touched us deeply.




FINANCIAL AND GIVING OVERVIEW



Megan remembers when she first heard those words with the joy of new life and the weight of life's challenges falling on her.

"I was so scared as I didn't have my own place, a car, or a steady income."

She had recently gone through a rehab treatment center and started her journey in sobriety living at a half-way house. Megan's friend, who is also a Maggie's Place mom, encouraged her to make the call that changed her life.

Your support is invaluable to moms like Megan. It gives a fresh start filled with accomplishments and the tools needed to continue to reach goals.

"Maggie's Place has been a solid support system in helping me persevere and stay consistent on working towards my goals. I learned very quickly that once I mentioned a goal or even an idea of something I would like to do/accomplish the [Ameri]Corp team would be like "okay, so what's the first step?"

"It was this type of love and unconditional support that helped me achieve results for each and everything I set out to do."

Because of you, Megan is celebrating many successes today. She recently moved out of Maggie's Place and into her own apartment with her boyfriend and son. She is in a healthy and stable relationship and celebrating two years of sobriety. Megan is focusing on her education, currently taking courses to obtain her Registered Nursing license!

Megan started her journey at Maggie's Place before the pandemic. She fostered a special bond with volunteers and faced the challenging experience of missing those in-person relationships during 2020.

Megan's son was born at the beginning of quarantine and, like many of our moms, wanted to share the experience with so many but was unable due to COVID-19.

Even though support from volunteers and our community became "no-contact," the love and sense of family was felt.

"Never would I have ever dreamed that I would meet so many people who truly love and care not only for me but for my son and my family as well."

Amy made her way to Maggie's Place after graduating from the University of Notre Dame, studying gender studies and psychology. Keri was working as a Teacher's Aide at a nature-based preschool right outside of Rocky Mountain National Park!

Both Amy and Keri remember how quickly Maggie's Place felt like home, welcomed by staff, volunteers, and donors.

"There were definitely moments where I felt like I had gotten in over my head; but, then a mom would be there to make me laugh or a baby would wave for the first time, or a volunteer would show up and send me off to my room to take some time to myself, or one of my teammates would pick up ice cream "just because," and all would be well." - Amy

Our homes wouldn't run without them and the rest of our AmeriCorps members, who spend a year living with our moms and their children - welcoming them into a loving, caring environment. They transform lives through hope, love, and a dedication to servant leadership.

As Team Leaders, Amy and Keri wear many hats. They are the extra support for the AmeriCorps team, act as a liaison between the homes and The Family Success Center, and give feedback on policies and procedures that are implemented in the homes.

Our AmeriCorps Team, along with the support from you, our volunteers and donors, kept our homes running smoothly during a pandemic year.

You got creative with how you supported our moms, children, and staff during a tough year.
